A ticket and seat is required for every person attending a performance despite age.

Students—Students of any age. You may be asked to show your ID.

Senior Citizens—Age 65 and older.

Staff—Any Moraine Valley faculty or staff member, as well as international host home participants.

Child—Any child up to age 12. All children must be able to sit in a seat and have a ticket. "Babes in arms" are not allowed.

Group—Discounted prices for most shows are available for groups of 20+. Call the Box Office for more details.
